They'll meet February 21 and continue to monitor Galloway's income & expenses. A letter will go out with giving statements indicating the financial health of Galloway Church.

THANK-YOU for going on a prayer journey with me this winter. There are a lot of things we can't do in our region in January and February, but there is one thing we can do - **we can learn to pray!**

It is very obvious in Scripture that the Lord wants us to pray. There are many commands given to us concerning prayer: *"Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up"* (Luke 18:1); *"And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints"* (Ephesians 6:18); *"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God"* (Philippians 4:6).

These are just a few of the directives in God's Word to pray. It is clear that God wants us to be **"people of prayer"** so that we might be a **"praying church"** so that God might be glorified and His kingdom be manifested here in our lives. We know this, yet a lot of us still struggle to pray.

We at Galloway are doing all we can to help you to become more consistent and faithful people of prayer. That's why the devotionals, messages, and Life Groups are all focusing on prayer in February.

The author of our devotional, Love to Pray, Dr. Alvin Vandergriend, of Harvest Prayer Ministries, points out there are three reasons given in God's Word for prayer:

- o **Intimacy with God** – prayer allows us to be in relationship with God, to know God's joy and to hear His voice.
- o **Enrichment** – prayer opens the door for us to receive all the blessings that God has for us.
- o **Partnership** – prayer allows us to partner with God. Could God do it alone? Absolutely, but he has chosen to work with us and through us so that others may be blessed.

Another way of looking at these three ... God has given us prayer as a means to:

Know God

Obey God

Partner with God in blessing others

So do you want to know God better and be better equipped to obey God and to bless others? Then let's continue on our prayer journey that we might "Love to Pray".

Pray with me...

Father, forgive me for my prayerless life! How can I know You if I don't spend time in your Word reflecting on your character and soaking in Your Presence? Create a hunger within me for more of You so that I will desire to obey Your word and to partner with You in the work of Your kingdom! In Jesus name - Amen.

Here are some **Prayer Points** for February. Pray for God's help so that you might:

- o Praise God as your beloved Father.
- o Give thanks as a dear child for the undeserved love and grace you receive from him.
- o Confess all the ways you have offended him.
- o Commit yourself to trusting and obeying.
- o Ask Christ to be with you always and to teach you to obey all things that He has commanded.
- o Pray for the ability to serve God in marriage and family life by reflecting God's covenant love in lifelong loyalty.
- o Teach His ways so that children and grandchildren may know Jesus as their Lord and learn to use their gifts in a life of joyful service.

Prayer Power for Parents!

Parents, let's get right to the point: How has your prayer time been in 2011? Is 2012 the year that you are going to commit to praying fervently for your children? As a parent, I must ask myself the same question. My answer is, YES. I am praying that as you read this you are able to join in unison with me. Start today! I am believing God for incredible testimony in the lives of children this year. I am convinced more and more that the enemy is trying to attack the next generation. Prayer is a privilege. Let's not take it for granted!

According to 1 Peter 4:10, "Each one should use whatever gift he has to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms." Your children were created, filled, and born with gifts. Some are very clear and others are waiting to be fostered for the glory of the Lord. We know from James 1:17 that every good and perfect gift is from above. The gifts are there; so let me ask you, "What do you see in your child?"

It should be your constant prayer to see your child exercise his God-given gifts through music, art, craftsmanship, compassion, hospitality, mercy, encouragement ... and many others. These gifts come from God and are manifested in our lives through the work of the Holy Spirit. If this work in your child's life is an unfamiliar concept, you may want to read up on how God's Spirit works, the kinds of gifts He offers, and the way Christians are urged to use these gifts. Start with Acts 2, Galatians 5, Ephesians 4, and 1 Corinthians 12 and 14, and if you want to go deeper just look up words like Spirit and gifts in your concordance.

One thing I know for sure is that each week in Camp J.C. the Holy Spirit is welcomed and present. Your children are moving, growing, and flowing in the Spirit. We are incredibly excited and privileged to watch your children being blessed with gifts, talents, and abilities that are better than anything you could imagine. Below are a few scriptures you can pray for in this area of your child's life.

- Give _____ a sense of destiny, and show her that You set her apart and appointed her with gifts and talents even before she was born. (Jeremiah 1:5)
- Show _____ how to use his gifts and talents wisely, being faithful with the abilities You have given him. (Matthew 25:21)



- You made some people apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers. Show _____ where he fits into Your divine arrangement, and let him use his gifts to prepare your people for works of service; so that the body of Christ may be built up in love. (Ephesians 4:16)
- Thank you for the special gift You have given _____. Show him now his gift differs from the gifts you have given others, and let him be generous, diligent, and cheerful in using it. (Romans 12:6-8)

Parents, in closing, I want to share a proverb that I once read. It's one that truly stuck with me and challenged my thinking and prayer life. "Pray like it depends on God, and work like it depends on you." Your children are depending on us. Together, we can make an eternal difference. Happy and faithful praying!!!

Ash Wednesday Service

February 22, 2012 at 7:00 P.M.



"Then said Jesus to his disciples, if any man will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross, and follow me." Matt. 16:24

We call it **Ash Wednesday**, but the official historic name is **Day of Ashes**. It's called Ash Wednesday because it's a 40 day period (no Sundays) preceding Good Friday and always falls on a Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday originated in the 10th century and obviously receives its name from the rich tradition of the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of the Christian believers. The ashes traditionally come from the palms of the previous Palm Sunday. The mark of ashes can be the Biblical expression of a number of things. I want to introduce you to three.

1. Ashes are a biblical symbol of mourning over sin. (Job 42:1-6)
2. Ashes also symbolize death and remind us of our own mortality, that one day we'll die and face the Judge. (Gen. 18:27, Luke 12:16-21)
3. Ashes are also a mark of our identification and ownership. When we receive the mark of ashes in the sign of the cross you are saying, "I belong to Jesus Christ!"

JOIN US on ASH WEDNESDAY as we mourn over our sin, repent of our sin, and identify ourselves with Jesus Christ.

I want you to hear from Rob Schenck, who is a missionary to Capitol Hill. He wrote this in an e-mail to me back in 2003, the day after Ash Wednesday:

It's an unusual thing whenever Christians boldly proclaim their witness for our Lord here on Capitol Hill. It's even more unusual when they walk around wearing their faith on their sleeves – or foreheads – for a whole day!

Ash Wednesday, when much of the world's Christian believers begin the 40-day season of Lent leading to the celebration of the Resurrection, was a curious site on Capitol Hill.

As I walked from Union Station, the commuter rail terminal, to our ministry center across the street from the US Supreme Court, I encountered a parade of people streaming out of a nearby church with ashen crosses drawn prominently on their foreheads. This may be a strange or even suspicious practice to some Christians. In the Evangelical world that I come from, these ancient Christian customs are sometimes looked at as empty tradition, or worse, superstitious ritual. But I had a very different reaction as I saw that long line of "Marked" pedestrians. I thought of how courageous it is for them to prominently display their Christianity in their often hoity-toity Capitol Hill work environments. After all, how many of us Evangelical types would go to work anywhere, let alone in the halls of government, wearing a sticker on our foreheads reading, "I belong to Christ."

Walking past those people on my way to the ministry center, I thought how wonderful to have Christians, marked for Christ, announcing their devotion, penitence and self-denial, literally picking up their crosses, stamping them on their foreheads and following Christ, up and down the halls of Capitol Hill! We need that kind of witness here. God bless their holy boldness.

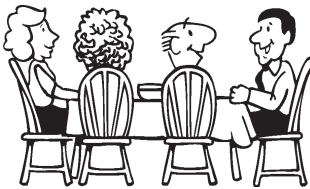

Galloway Church has been registered for GoodSearch and GoodShop. When doing searches, please use GoodSearch.com. Since we started with GoodSearch in the fall of 2008, we have made \$159.24 for searches and \$200.51 for shopping, giving us a total of \$354.75. To add this search engine go to GoodSearch.com. Click on Add GoodSearch to your IE, Firefox, or Mac toolbar (about 3/4 down the page). At the screen to install - go to #1 and click on Download Now. Click on download Good Search to the toolbar. Click Run. Follow instructions to finish the download. Where it asks for your charity - type Galloway Church (select the Galloway Church from Franklin, PA). You can also go into GoodShop from this screen and it will show you all the areas where you can buy merchandise and the percentage that will be donated to the church.

Ministry Council Summary 1/10/2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Shane McCoy and opened in prayer. Shane shared about an encounter with a family whose children attended Mega Sports Camp and the family has been involved in other ministries at Galloway including MOPS, Clothing Ministry, etc. They attend a small church but have been blessed by Galloway in many ways and encouraged Shane that we should continue all that we do.



Meeting Minutes - The November meeting minutes were reviewed and approved after two small errors where corrected.

Pastor's Moment

Pastor Seth shared his disappointment about how few participated in the Church wide outreach in the fall. He is challenging us to be more inviting of those who don't attend church.

Actions Following Annual Charge Conference

A mini retreat on creating a culture of honor and respect is being considered. Discussion of past retreats and how they have been organized was held. Possible dates in spring or fall 2012.

Staff & Area Reports

Financial Report - The reports were distributed and reviewed. A lengthy discussion of the current financial situation was held. Full details are available in the Ministry Council Minutes.

SPRC - Paul Butler and Chris Garich have been nominated and accepted for SPRC.

Communication - The father/daughter ball and Marriage Tune Up will be advertised in the paper.

Conference Concerns - Pastor encouraged folks to be praying about general conference.

Congregational Care - Lisa shared that 22 gift cards were sent to college students before Christmas.

Children's Ministry - Kim and Amy were at the Children's Conference that they attend every year.

Fellowship - King's Jesters is securing a date and theme for their next event.

Missions - Dave Seyler noted that the Angel Tree was able to provide presents for 97 children. Handi Helpers provided for the 10 children names not taken by the congregation. 125 Haitian children/staff from the two orphanages, Lambs & Messes, were provided gifts for Christmas for a total of \$1250. \$550 of the \$1250 was given as a donation from a member of the congregation and the balance of \$700 from the Missions Budget. The Missions Committee intends to provide a one-time donation of \$300 to Celebrate Recovery.

Prayer - Robin and Pastor shared that there are 13 life groups using the 40 days of prayer resource.

Youth Report - Dan shared that he is going to be partnering in ministry with the youth pastor from the AAUB church for some events.
